

# Voice of New Hope







How can the shortest month in the year contain so many worship opportunities? If it seems that Lent is coming early this year, it is!

As February begins we are completing the Sundays of Epiphany. Then we move to the Transfiguration of our Lord on February 11. The "alleluia" is put away until Easter and we are enabled to see the God-light in Jesus' face.

This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14...yes Valentine's Day! Somehow that seems odd. But on Ash Wednesday as we receive ashes and experience an intensification of our regular rite of Confession and Forgiveness, we can consider the state of our hearts. The prayer of the day speaks for "new and honest hearts."

February 18 and February 25 are the first and second Sundays in Lent. This year's scriptures focus on *covenant themes*. The first and second Sundays in Lent will highlight God's covenant with Noah after the flood and God's covenant with Abraham and Sarah, making them the ancestors of many.

As we journey through this short month of February let's remember the importance of each of the Sundays. On the last Sunday, February 25, Jesus tells his disciples for the first time what is to come (Mark 8:31-38). Jesus calls his followers...that's us...to take up our cross and follow the path he takes.

In two weeks we have quite the eventful day on our calendars. Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> is the feast of St. Valentine, also known commercially throughout many regions of the world as Valentine's Day. Many will celebrate the gift of loved ones with flowers and candy; yet, this

day also marks the beginning of something else important in the life of the church and our congregation. February 14<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday. This day marks the beginning of Lent, and journey with Christ to the Cross. On Ash Wednesday we remember our mortality, that we are but dust and to dust we shall return. our journey of faith together that you are well in mind, body, and spirit. I especially pray that you all do not experience the effects of this overwhelming influenza outbreak this year. I am blessed to serve this community, and thankful for all you do. As we walk in the shadow of the cross, may the peace of the Lord be with you always...


